

Revenue In Millions


Revenue decline reflects lower wallboard sales volume and prices, partially offset by improved cement sales volume and prices.

First Quarter, In Millions




First Quarter wallboard sales volume down 7% and net sales prices down 6%






Oil and Gas Proppants


